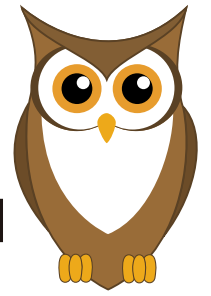




Owl Babies

**IVY LEAF
TEMPLATE**

You will need:

- cardboard box
- ivy leaf printable
- pencil
- glue
- scissors
- string
- green paint & paint brush
- white paper
- black marker
- sticky tape
- hole punch

*You could always buy an artificial ivy garland (they are widely available and relatively inexpensive).

Trim it to the length required to work as a sash and then use sticky tape to join the ends together.

How to make:



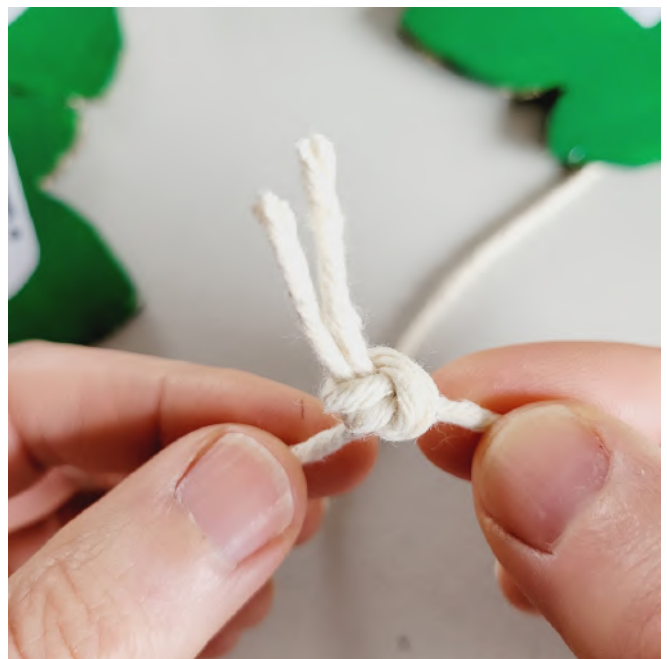
1. Make an ivy leaf template by printing out the ivy leaf printable page. Glue it onto card and cut out.
2. Draw 4 ivy leaf shapes on the cardboard.



- 3. Cut the ivy leaves out.**
- 4. Paint one side green. Leave to dry.
Paint the other side and leave to dry.**



- 5. Make 2 holes at the top and bottom of each ivy leaf as shown. (I used a holepunch).**
- 6. Cut a length of string about 1 metre. Wrap sticky tape around one end as shown. This will make the end easier to thread through the cardboard leaves.**



3. Thread each leaf onto the length of string. Measure the garland around your child so it fits comfortably worn as a sash over their shoulder with the leaves at the front.
4. Tie the loose ends of string together, trimming if necessary.



5. On white paper, write the words 'I want my mummy!' twice as shown. Leave some space between each word so you can cut the words out individually. Stick each word on a separate leaf in the correct order.
6. Stick the remaining set of words on the other side of the leaves. This way, it won't matter if the ivy garland gets twisted as it will be identical on both sides.
